

# Biography of William M. Kizer [#173] (1837-1895)

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#### **Preface**

William M. Kizer is my great-great-grandfather. I was first introduced to the Kizer family history by my maternal grandfather (William's grandson) Demus Cornelius Kizer (1900-1977). As a youngster in California in the 1960s-1970s, I enjoyed listening to Grandpa's stories about growing up in rural Arkansas. I was particularly fascinated with all of the people he mentioned, and often I asked him how he was related to each of them. He collected a lot of photographs of his family, and was a prolific correspondent with his relatives.

In 1973, when I had just turned age 16, Grandpa took me and another one of his grandsons to visit his family in Texas and Arkansas. We spent several days in the area around Mulberry and Ozark (in Crawford County and Franklin County) and got to visit a number of the places I had heard about and met many fascinating people.

This inspired my lifelong interest in genealogy, which I have pursued to this day. Although I have researched a number of my other family lineages through the years, my most extensive work has been done on the Kizer family (and it remains my favorite topic). By building a strong trail of evidence through correspondence with Demus's siblings and cousins and researching primary sources (particularly the USA federal census records and county vital records), I was able to trace my Kizers far enough back to connect to other researchers who were working on the same family. I found that my mother's Kizer surname (spelled with a "z") was only one variation of the name spelled by other branches of the family (further back) as Kiser (predominantly) and Keiser. The name (German, as it turned out) was spelled as Kaÿser prior to the immigration to America.

My branch of this large family had come to Arkansas in the 1850s by way of Tennessee (1810) and Virginia (1783), after the arrival of William M. Kizer's great-grandfather Michael Kaÿser/Kiser in Pennsylvania from Germany (landing at Philadelphia aboard the ship Edinburgh on 13 August 1750). Michael was born in Rumpenheim, Hesse, Germany around 1734, and his Kaÿser lineage has been traced back to the 1500s through local Rumpenheim parish registers. Of the 23,000+ descendants identified so far of Michael Kiser and his wife Mary Lingel|Eppert, they had at least 614 great-grandchildren. This document is the story of one of his great-grandsons (William M. Kizer).

#### The Goodspeed Biography

The Goodspeed Publishing Company of Chicago, Illinois published a large number of county histories and biographies in the 1880s and 1890s. One of these, *History of Benton, Washington, Carroll, Madison, Crawford, Franklin, and Sebastian Counties, Arkansas* (Chicago, IL: Goodspeed Publishing Co., 1889), contained a biography of our William M. Kizer on page 1251-1252. This a good place for us to start.

Like many biographies written late in life, this one contains a number of inaccuracies that were revealed by further in-depth research using older, primary sources. I'm not sure what Goodspeed's specific methodology was for getting this information, but I imagine it involved some combination of interviews and correspondence with the subjects themselves. Since William's parents both died when he was a youngster and he and his siblings lived far apart from their Kizer relatives for the remainder of their lives, I would consider the recollections about his parents' backgrounds as being somewhat "approximate". The information about his adult life is likely to be much more accurate. Having said that, this biography contains some wonderful clues for further research that enabled us to eventually trace this family back to Virginia and (earlier) to Germany.

"William M. Kizer, one of the leading citizens of White Oak Township, was born in Morgan County, Mo., April 18, 1837, and is a son of Valentine and Frances (Davis) Kizer, natives of Bedford County, Tenn., and North Carolina, respectively. They were married in the father's native county, and about 1831 came to Missouri, locating in Salem County, where they resided for a while, and afterwards removed to Osage County, where they died. They were farmers and both died at the age of about forty-two years, leaving a family of five small children in destitute circumstances: Nancy H., Susan, William, John D. and Frances. All are living but Frances. They were reared by an uncle, who brought them from Missouri to Franklin County, Ark., in 1854. William began working as a farm laborer after coming to Arkansas, and continued this occupation for four years, when he entered a tract of land, and began farming on his own responsibility. At the end of two years he gave up farming to aid the Southern cause, enlisting in July, 1862, in Company I, Thirty-fourth Arkansas Infantry. At the close of the war his company was disbanded at Marshall, Tex., and he resided in that State, whither his family had previously moved, until November, 1865, when he returned to Franklin County, Ark., and here has since made his home. He was without a penny that he could call his own at the close of the war, but by industry and economy he was soon able to purchase a tract of land, consisting of forty acres, which he has from time to time increased, until he now owns 240 acres of valuable and well-cultivated land. His success in life is due to his indomitable energy, perseverance, and good management, and to his cheerful, practical and intelligent wife. On the 26th of January, 1859, he was married to Miss Thurzy M. Shaver, a daughter of Jacob B. Shaver. She was born in Washington County, Ark., March 13, 1836, and her union with Mr. Kizer resulted in the birth of nine children, six of whom are living: Madora J., wife of W. A. Lloyd; Laura Lorena, wife of T. F. Anderson; John A., Taylor E., Clark M. and Martha M. Those deceased are Jacob V., Sarepta L. and Flora Ann. Mr. and Mrs. Kizer, and all but their youngest child, are members of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, and he is a Democrat in his political views. Mrs. Kizer's father was a native of North Carolina, but removed to Tennessee and an early day, from which State he came to Washington County, Ark. He was a soldier in the War of 1812, being at the battle of New Orleans, and died in 1883 at the extreme old age of ninety-six."

The middle initial ("M") in William M. Kizer's name probably stands for McCord, but I have not seen anything in the primary sources to confirm that. In some notes taken by my grandfather Demus C. Kizer from a conversation he had with his father (William's son Taylor E. Kizer), it says that the middle initial stands for Mason, and that William's mother was named Frances McCord Davis. Other descen-

dants of William maintain that his middle name was actually McCord. I'm not sure which is true. Taylor's brother Clark's middle name was Mason, so maybe Taylor was confused about his father's middle name. Maybe not.

Very little is known about William's mother. Her birthplace is given as North Carolina in the Goodspeed biography, but census records of her (in 1850) and her children (in 1880 and 1900) also give her state of birth as Virginia, Tennessee, or Alabama. I really don't think her children knew where she was born, or where their father was born, either. (They consistently gave Tennessee as his place of birth, although he was clearly born in Virginia.) When Valentine Kizer and Frances (Davis) Kizer died in the early 1850s, they did not leave a "family of five small children". Assuming that Frances died about 1852 when Valentine died, their five surviving children at that time would have ranged in age from the oldest (Nancy) at 20 years (and married for over a year!) to the youngest (Salena Frances) at about five years.

The identity of the uncle who "reared" them (per the Goodspeed biography) and brought them from Osage County, Missouri to Franklin County, Arkansas in 1854 is still a mystery. By 1860, the four youngest children of Valentine were all living in the same household (with William as the head of household with his new wife and their twin baby daughters). They were not with the uncle. None of Valentine's siblings were known to have lived in Missouri or Arkansas at that time. Maybe the uncle was a brother of Frances, but nothing is known about her family (Davis).

What do we know about William's parents prior to their deaths around 1852?

#### Tennessee to Missouri (before 1854)

William M. Kizer's father Valentine Kizer (Jr.) was born to Valentine Kizer (Sr.) and Catherine Stiehl around 1804-1805, probably in Rockbridge County, Virginia. Valentine (Sr.) and Catherine were married in 1782 in Berks County, Pennsylvania and came to Virginia's Shenandoah Valley in 1783, settling in Rockingham County. They moved from Rockingham County to Rockbridge County (a bit further south in the Valley) in 1796. Catherine died around 1807 and Valentine (Sr.) remarried in that year to Nancy Berry. In 1810, Valentine (Sr.) and Nancy Kizer and sold their land in Rockbridge County, Virginia and they and the children moved about 500 miles west to Bedford County, Tennessee. Valentine (Sr.) lived and farmed there until his death around 1827. Nancy died in Bedford County in 1844.

Valentine Kizer and Frances Davis were probably married between 1825 and 1831 in Bedford County, Tennessee. However, no marriage records have been found in Bedford County from that period to confirm the place or date of the marriage. Nothing is known about her background and her place of birth remains unclear. Valentine (Jr.) does not appear as head of household in the 1830 census of Bedford County, so he is probably still living in his stepmother Nancy (Berry) Kizer's household, perhaps with his new wife.

Their first child, a daughter Nancy H. Kizer, was born in Tennessee (probably Bedford County) on 25 November 1831. Shortly afterwards, Valentine and Frances moved from Tennessee about 500 miles northwest to Saline County, Missouri (the "Salem County" of the Goodspeed biography). Valentine's brother William Kizer and at least two of their Kiser cousins from Virginia had already moved to Saline County by that time. (Valentine's brother William, no doubt the namesake for our William M. Kizer, left Saline County, Missouri for Texas by around 1840.)

The index to the Saline County deeds lists one deed<sup>1</sup> from George Hall to a Valentine Kiser and another deed<sup>2</sup> from a Valentine Kiser to Edwin Haynie. No other deeds involving Valentine are listed, so it appears he did not own land in Saline County for very long. (I have not read the text of the deeds to learn of the dates or land descriptions involved.) How long he remained in Saline County is not clear, but Valentine Kizer next appears in the 1840 census of Gibson Township, Gasconade County, Missouri (about 80 miles to the southeast).

Note the spelling of the surname – Keiser. It is not unusual in those times for a name to be spelled many different ways (sometimes within the same document!), according to the phonetic pronunciation and the whim of the person recording the name. The ages of Valentine and the adult female in the household (his wife Frances) are given in the 1840 census as being between 20 and 30 years, but (as the 1850 census will show), they were more likely in their mid-30s. Again, this is a common pitfall of the pre-1850 censuses, where the ages are listed in categories. (Even in later censuses, the individuals – particularly the women – don't always age 10 years between censuses . . .) Four children are shown in the Valentine Kizer household in 1840 – 1 boy under age 5, 1 girl under age 5, and two girls between 5 and 10. Who are they? The oldest child is Nancy H. (born 1831 in Tennessee). The next child, daughter Susan Kizer, was born in Missouri between 1833 and 1835. The third child, son William M. Kizer (our guy), was born in Missouri on 18 April 1837. The identify of the other girl is not known. This was probably a daughter born in the late 1830s who did not survive long after the 1840 census.

Where in Missouri were Susan and William born? The Goodspeed biography says that William was born in Morgan County. That county is about 25 miles south of Saline County and about 65 miles west of where they lived in Gasconade County. I am not aware of any records showing Valentine's presence in Morgan County (which was formed from Cooper County in 1833), but there must be some reason why it was stated as William's birthplace in the Goodspeed biography. To be safe, let's say that Susan and William were born somewhere in Missouri, perhaps Saline County, Morgan County, or Gasconade County. (More research needs to be done with the tax lists and deeds for these counties to see if and when Valentine lived there.)

They didn't live in Gasconade County for very long. The county moved, not them. On 29 January 1841, Osage County was formed from the western portion of Gasconade County, including what was Gibson Township in 1840.

Valentine Kizer appears as a witness to a will written by his neighbor Samuel Shobe in Osage County on 12 May 1841 (proved 8 April 1846)<sup>3</sup>. Samuel Shobe (age 40 to 50) was listed in the 1840 Gasconade County census five households after Valentine.

Valentine and Frances had another child, son John Davis Kizer, born about this time (7 November 1842), probably in Osage County. (A delayed birth certificate filed in 1942 for one of John Davis Kizer's sons, James Carrell Kizer<sup>4</sup>, gives John's place of birth as Platte City, Platte County, Missouri, but that is not very likely since they were living in Osage County, on the other side of the state, at the time. The witness for this birth, and probably the provider of the information about John Davis Kizer, was Madora Jane (Kizer) Loyd, the oldest surviving child of William M. Kizer. She was born in 1859 and did not have first-hand knowledge of John Davis Kizer's birth, which had occurred almost 100 years earlier.)

Where in Osage County did they live? An Osage County deed<sup>5</sup> dated 3 December 1842, records the sale of land from Valentine and Frances (of Osage County) to Robert Stephens (of Callaway County) for 23.19 acres on "Island 58" in the Missouri River in Township 45 North, Range 8 West (T45N R8W). This is currently located in Benton Township in Osage County (which was a part of the old Gibson Township in Gasconade before the formation of Osage County in 1841). The purchase of this land by Valentine was probably recorded in one of the Gasconade County deed books, but I have not found that deed yet.

Here is the text of the 1842 deed, in which they sold the land:

"This indenture made the 3d day of December 1842 between Valentine Kiszer and Francis Kizer his wife of Osage County Mo of the one part and Robert Stephens of Callaway County Mo of the other part . . . that the said Valentine Kizer and Francis Kizer his wife for & in consideration of the sum of fifty dollars in hand paid the receipt . . . acknowledged have granted . . . and do by their presents grant . . . unto the said Robert Stevens his heirs and assigns forever all the rights and interests in and to the following tract or parcel of land on which the said Kizer is now residing & which he . . . of purchase from James H. Burcham situated and lying in Osage County in the State of Missouri containing twenty three and 19/100 acres more or less which is the east part of two fractions . . . Island No. 58 in Missouri River in township No. forty five North of Range No Eight West the dividing line begins by a cotton wood stump on the south side bank on the River and . . . from this stump due South 18 chains to a cotton wood tree on the south side of the Island further on across the . . . 62 chains to a Mulberry stake on the bank of the Bottom from which a Sycamore 14 inches diameter bearing S 37 1/2 [degrees] W 17...together with all and singular the appurtenances there unto belonging to have and to hold the above described premises unto the said Robert Stevens his heirs and assigns forever and the said Valentine Kizer & Francis Kizer his wife a good and lawful title to the above described premises do hereby warrant and defend to the said Robert Stevens his heirs etc. forever against the claims and demands of the said Valentine Kizer and Francis Kizer his wife and against the claims and demands of their heirs & assigns and against the claim and demand of each and every person or persons whatsover . . . where of the said Valentine Kizer and Francis Kizer his wife have hereunto set their hands & seals this day & year first above written viz the 3 dy of December 1842.



The 1842 deed gives the township/range, but does not indicate a section. Within a township/range, there are 36 sections, each typically one mile square, or 640 acres. Sometimes this rule does not hold, such as when a river or geographic boundary is in the way. Based on the description, they lived on an island ("58") in the Missouri River on the Benton Township (T45N R8W) side in Osage County.





Valentine appears on the Osage County personal property tax list of 1844, with nothing but one poll tax (one adult white male). This means he owned no horses, cattle, or slaves. He also does not appear on that year's land tax list, meaning he probably did not purchase any more land in Osage County. No other Valentine Kizer deeds exist for that county.

After selling this land in 1842, they moved a little further west in the county to Linn Township, where they appear on the 1850 census.

There are a few problems with this census entry. Valentine's wife's name is given as Nancy, not Frances. There is no other evidence that he had remarried between 1842 and 1850, so this is probably still Frances (Davis) Kizer. Maybe the census enumerator got her name confused with the oldest daughter, Nancy. (The daughter Nancy's place of birth is given as Missouri, but later censuses show her birth-place to be Tennessee.) John's age is given as 10 years, while he was actually a bit younger. And there was another daughter, Salena Frances, not shown in this census, who was born about 1847-1848, probably in Osage County. (When there are a number of known inaccuracies for a particular family on a census, it may indicate that the census enumerator didn't get the information first-hand from a knowledgeable family member and had to make some educated guesses, perhaps with the assistance of a neighbor. That might be the case here.)

Both Valentine and Nancy give their place of birth as Virginia, which we know to be correct in his case. He is shown as a laborer, not a farmer. At this point, he owned no land. He does not appear as a slave owner on the 1850 slave schedules.

Not long after this census, on 1 January 1851, the oldest daughter Nancy married to Patrick M. Baker<sup>6</sup>. He was in the 1850 census in Linn Township with, presumably, his sisters. The marriage was performed by John Carey, Justice of the Peace.

The date of Valentine Kizer's death was between 13 November 1850 (census) and 9 February 1852 (first date of judgments against his estate). The final settlement value of his estate is \$7.09 and there is no real property (land) to be distributed, so this is consistent with the "destitute circumstances" described in the Goodspeed biography.

The following entries are from Osage County Probate Book A (1841-1857):

"Ordered that J. [or I.] S. Fortner be appointed guardian of the person of John Keiser and Francis Keiser the former aged 8 years and the latter 6 years."

The \$3.25 bill from Drs. Rainey and Burch may indicate that Valentine was given medical attention for an illness or injury. The cause of his death is not known.

The guardianship of the two minor children (under age 16) is assigned to J. [or I.] S. Fortner. There is a John Fortner listed in the 1850 census of Washington Township in Osage County. Would that be the guardian? Was he the uncle to which the Goodspeed biography refers? Was Frances (Davis) Kizer dead by 1853? By this time, the three older children (Nancy, Susan, and William) were at least 16 years of age, so they would not have been assigned a guardian. Some of John Davis Kizer's descendants stated that the uncle was John Davis, a brother of Frances. That lead is being pursued, but nothing to confirm that relationship has yet been found.

This John Fortner does not appear to be listed in the 1860 census. His son Theodore was married in Osage County in 1857, indicating that they still lived in that county after the orphans were brought to Franklin County, Arkansas (270 miles southwest of Osage County) in 1854.

#### Arkansas (1854-1865)

The first appearance of this family in Arkansas is indicated by the marriage in Franklin County on 14 September 1854 of Valentine's oldest daughter Nancy (Kizer) Baker to Joseph P. Shaver, by G. W. C. Nixon, Justice of the Peace<sup>7</sup>. What happened to Patrick M. Baker, whom she married in 1851?

On 26 January 1859, William M. Kizer married Thurza Malinda Shaver at White Oak Township<sup>8</sup>:

"I hereby certify the I solemnized the rite of matrimony between William Kizer and Thurzey Shaver on the 26th day of January 1859 in the Township of White Oak in the County of Franklin and State of Arkansas both of lawful age. Given under my hand this 27th day of January 1859.

Filed and Recorded Feb. 1st AD 1859

Thurza Malinda Shaver was a younger sister of Joseph P. Shaver. Their parents, Jacob Blackwelder Shaver (a veteran of the War of 1812) and Thurza Moss, had married in 1820 in Lawrence County, Arkansas Territory (later to be Randolph County, Arkansas). Jacob and Thurza arrived in Franklin County about 1849. Thurza died there on 18 March 1854 (about six months before Joseph's marriage to Nancy). Jacob Shaver remained in Franklin County until his death on 19 August 1884.

According to Jacob's 1884 obituary in an Ozark, Franklin County newspaper, his family belonged to the White Oak congregation of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church starting in 1851. This is the same church to which William M. Kizer's family belonged, according to the Goodspeed biography. This would suggest that they lived fairly close to one another.



In 1850, Jacob Shaver's family was in White Oak Township, but in Mulberry Township in 1860. William M. Kizer and his siblings would establish their homesteads together in the part of White Oak Township northwest of Ozark that would be located in Cravens Township upon its formation about 1890. (Cravens Township was formed from the western part of White Oak Township and the eastern part of Mulberry Township.)

The map at the left shows the current formation of the townships in Franklin County. Where Cravens Township is now located is probably the area where the Shaver and Kizer families lived starting in the 1850s.

Other than Nancy and Joseph Shaver, who were living in nearby Mulberry Township, the 1860 census found all of William M. Kizer's siblings living in his household in White Oak Township, along with his new wife Thurza and their twin daughters Madora Jane and Flora Ann, who were born 11 December 1859.

William and his brother John were farming, but they owned no land at this point in time. Perhaps they were leasing the land upon which they farmed. They do not appear as a slave owners on the 1860 slave schedules.

Susan soon left this household to marry Ambrose McCorkle on 2 January 1862 (by R. K. Pound, Minister of the Gospel<sup>9</sup>). In the meantime, the Civil War was now underway. Arkansas had voted to secede from the Union on 6 May 1861. Ambrose McCorkle enlisted with Company I of the Arkansas 15<sup>th</sup> (Northwest) Infantry Regiment on 8 February 1862 at Ozark.

William and Thurza's third child, a son named Jacob Valentine (after both of his grandfathers), was born on 8 May 1862.

On 2 July 1862 in Ozark, William enlisted to serve with Company I of the Arkansas 34<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment. (John joined the same Company later that year.) The 34<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment was formed in the summer of 1862 from counties in northwest Arkansas (Company I's recruits coming from Franklin County). The unit was assigned to Fagan's, A.T. Hawthorne's, and Roane's Brigade in the Trans-Mississippi Department and participated in the conflicts at Helena and Jenkins Ferry. It continued the fight in some minor actions in Arkansas and Louisiana. Colonel William H. Brooks, Lieutenant Colonels T. M. Gunter and James R. Pettigrew, and Major F. R. Earle were in command. This was also known as Brook's Infantry Regiment.

Fortunately, two letters survive from soldier William M. Kizer to his wife Thurza in late 1862. They paint a vivid picture of the conditions during the war in the west from a Confederate perspective. Of particular note are the compassion for the other soldiers (on both sides of the war) and a healthy skepticism regarding rumors about the war's progress. It would be very interesting to find other letters from later in the war (if they were ever written) to learn of his feelings as the war dragged on and times became increasingly desperate.



I drop you a few lines to let you know that I am well but the food that we have is enough to make many of us sick. Flour with out any thing but cold water. Beef & not salt enough to salt it. I hope that you have plenty and all in good health. The most of the boys are well & in good spirits. I want you to have your letters at Hendersons Bourlands when Squire Ramny comes about so he can get them. Have your letters there by Wednesday weeak if not soooner. You will here when he comes around. Tell me all the knews . . . [something about harvesting wheat] . . . & how the people are in regard to health. I will close as I haft to go on gard in a few minutes.

Oct. 6<sup>th</sup> 1862

Dear Thurza,

This evening 130 prisoners arrived in camp. They were taken the other day in a fight at Newtonia, Mo. We hear that there are 800 standing arms at Van Buren for this regiment. If so we will be apt to leave here soon for Mo. We heard this evening that Stonewall had whipped the feds in Pennsylvania and had taken 30,000 prisoners. If this be so it is a great achievement for our cause. But doubt the report. Tell Joe's and Isaac's folks to write to me as I cannot get paper to write to them. Also Lancaster's folks. The report here in Camp is that . . . is retreating from the feds.

Gen. Reins has not reinforced him and says he wants them to still follow him until we get arms enough to capture them. I must close hoping this may find you and children in good health.

I remain your Affectionate husband.

William M. Kizer

Those prisoners were the most miserable looking creatures you ever saw. Some of them were bare headed. We hear there are 7000 Texans at Crop Hollows. But doubt it. We hear all sorts of reports, good, bad, and indifferent. But hope we may fight the good fight and come alive and victorious in the end.

The following spring (1863) two of William and Thurza's three children died (Flora Ann on 10 April at age three; Jacob Valentine on 16 April at age 11 months), perhaps from an infectious disease. No more is seen of William's youngest sister Salena Frances, who would have been about 16 years old at this time, after the 1860 census. Did she also die during the spring of 1863?

Thurza had six brothers, five of whom fought for the Confederacy. However, her brother Joseph (who married William's sister Nancy) enlisted with Company K of the Kansas Infantry (Union) on 14 December 1863. The family story is that Nancy encouraged him to fight for the Union side in order to get a pension (figuring they would win the war). Joseph's father Jacob Shaver reportedly disowned him as a result. Joseph never did return to live in Franklin County after the war.

During the spring of 1864, William spent about three months in a Confederate hospital in Shreveport, Louisiana (for diarrhea). He returned to the 34<sup>th</sup> Arkansas Infantry Regiment later in the year and served until the unit was disbanded on 15 May 1865 (at Marshall, Texas, according to the Goodspeed biography). (His brother John was discharged at about the same time.)

Marshall is in Harrison County, Texas, only about 40 miles west of Shreveport, Louisiana. According to the Goodspeed biography,

"At the close of the war his company was disbanded at Marshall, Tex., and he resided in that State, whither his family had previously moved, until November, 1865, when he returned to Franklin County, Ark., and here has since made his home. He was without a penny that he could call his own at the close of the war . . ."

By this time, they only had one remaining child living (Madora Jane, called "Jenny"), the other two having died in 1863. On 19 December 1865, their fourth child, daughter Laura Lorena was born in Franklin County. If, as stated in the Goodspeed biography, they returned from Marshall, Texas in November (from about 220 miles south of Franklin County), Thurza would have been eight months pregnant when they made the journey.

#### Arkansas (1866 and later)

After the war, William M. Kizer was destitute, as were many veterans returning to their homes in Arkansas. As stated in the Goodspeed biography,

"... but by industry and economy he was soon able to purchase a tract of land, consisting of forty acres."

During the 1870s-1880s (as we'll see a little later), William, John, and Susan all purchased adjoining plots of land just south of the Cravens community. It was to this part of Franklin County they probably returned to and reestablished their lives immediately after the war. (The deeds of the 1860s need to be more closely examined to find the purchase of the 40 acres referenced in Goodspeed.)

The Kizer family continued to grow. William and Thurza's fifth child was born, a son John Andrew on 21 November 1868. The following spring, on 29 April 1869, William's brother John married to Sarah Hood<sup>10</sup>.

The 1870 census of Franklin County, Arkansas does not list any of the Kizer family (or the Shavers, either). It appears that the census enumerator missed that part of the population, for whatever reason. William's sister Nancy, her husband Joseph Shaver, and their family were living in Searcy County, Arkansas.

Four more children were born to William and Thurza Kizer in the 1870s:

sixth child – son Taylor Earl Kizer, born 8 February 1871 seventh child – son Clark Mason Kizer, born 20 February 1873 eighth child – daughter Sarepta L. Kizer, born ca. 1875, died before 1880 census ninth (and last) child – Martha Malinda Kizer, born 5 January 1878

William's daughter Madora Jane "Jenny" Kizer married on 12 October 1879 to Walton A. Loyd<sup>11</sup>. (They named their first daughter Seripita Lorena "Rippie" after Jenny's recently deceased baby sister.)

The Goodspeed biography (published in 1889) says that, after the war, William built up his land holdings in Franklin County:

"... but by industry and economy he was soon able to purchase a tract of land, consisting of forty acres, which he has from time to time increased, until he now owns 240 acres of valuable and well-cultivated land."

How did he acquire this land, when was it purchased, and from whom? What eventually happened to the land? Some of these questions can be answered by examining the Franklin County deeds and the USA Bureau of Land Management (BLM) General Land Office records

(http://www.glorecords.blm.gov/), which record the transfer of publicly held lands to private individuals.

The following Franklin County deeds and BLM entries from the 1870s and 1880s involve William M. Kizer, his brother John, and sister Susan:





The BLM records include land for which the title was still held by the federal government. The land was disposed of by the authority of many acts of Congress - sale, homesteads, warrants for military service, timber culture, mining, etc. One of the primary purposes of these public land laws was to encourage people from the East to move west. Under the Cash Act, people could buy public land for cash, up to 640 acres. The Homestead Act of 1862, allowed people to settle up to 160 acres of public land if they lived on it for five years and grew crops or made improvements. This homestead land did not cost anything per acre, but the settler did pay a filing fee. The homestead acquisitions by William and John in 1876 show that they lived and farmed on the land since 1871 or earlier.

Where exactly was this land located? The descriptions in the land records indicate the coordinates within the rectangular survey system (e.g., townships, ranges, and sections). For a description of this system, see <a href="http://www.glorecords.blm.gov/Visitors/PLSS.asp">http://www.glorecords.blm.gov/Visitors/PLSS.asp</a>. The land acquired by William, John, and Susan was adjacent to each other in what is now Cravens Township in central Franklin County, about 4.5 miles northwest of the town of Ozark and a little over a mile south-southeast of the Cravens community.

Of the deeds and BLM records found so far, we see that William had acquired 200 acres, John 120 acres, and Susan 40 acres. This may not be complete, as the Goodspeed biography says that William (in 1889) had 240 acres of land. More detailed research into the Franklin County deeds needs to be done.

There are 640 acres (or one square mile) in a full section (e.g, Section 19). Each quarter-section is 160 acres. So, four 40-acres square plots of land would fit within a quarter-section.

The 120 acres indicated in "plot 5" above, which William purchased from the estate of John A. McKinney in 1884, was originally obtained from public lands with a cash patent on 20 September 1839 by Kendall Webb. Two of Kendall Webb's children married siblings of Thurza and Joseph Shaver (son

John Perkins Webb to Mary Narcissa Shaver on 6 February 1851<sup>12</sup> and daughter Margaret Jane Webb to Isaac Milton Shaver on 26 May 1852). Jacob Blackwelder Shaver (father of Thurza, Joseph, John, and Margaret) obtained the original land patent (homestead on 30 December 1882) for 80 acres (S ½ of SE ¼ of Section 1, T10N R28W). This was about one mile due north of the Cravens community. He probably lived near there since not long after his arrival in Franklin County around 1849. (See <a href="http://arslanmb.org/shaver/images/AR-FranklinCo-Land-JacobBShaver-1.jpg">http://arslanmb.org/shaver/images/AR-FranklinCo-Land-JacobBShaver-1.jpg</a>.)

Directly to the west of Section 19, T10N R27W is Section 25, T10N R28W. (I think that the original boundary between Mulberry Township and White Oak Township before the formation of Craven Township in 1890 may have been the range line between R27W and R28W.) The 40 acres in the NE ¼ of the NE ¼ of section 25 (directly adjacent on the west side to the southernmost 40 acres of William's "plot 5") was obtained through a homestead patent by Walton A. Loyd (husband of Madora Jane "Jenny") on 17 October 1888. The 80 acres directly to his south (also adjacent to William Kizer's land) was acquired through homesteading by his mother Louisa (Champion) Loyd on 1 Jun 1882.

The 80 acres directly to the south of William Kizer's land in the SW ¼ of Section 19 was acquired on 1 July 1911 through the Homestead Act by James Jason Brooks. (He married on 24 October 1900 to Sarah Frances Shaver<sup>13</sup>, a daughter of Thurza's younger brother Francis Marion Shaver.)

(For reference today, Interstate 40 (I-40) now runs east-west through the north half of Section 19.)



In agreement with the land records, the 1880 census shows the households of the Kizer siblings to be adjacent to one another. The entries for William, Susan, and John all show that their father and mother were born in Tennessee. (It would not be unusual for them to be unaware of their parent's birthplaces, since they were so young when the parents died and apparently did not live in close proximity to any surviving relatives on either side of the family.)

In 1880, their sister Nancy and her husband Joseph Shaver's family were living in Wright County, Missouri. That census entry shows Nancy born in Tennessee, her father born in Tennessee, and her mother born in Alabama. (Alabama? Oh, well . . .)

Susan, in 1880, was a widow. Nothing is known about what happened to her husband Ambrose McCorkle after his discharge from Confederate service at the end of the Civil War. On 26 September 1882, Susan remarried to Phillip A. D. Smith, a 66-year-old recently widowed preacher. After the 1885-1886 land records mentioned earlier, nothing more is known about Susan or her two daughters. Phillip A. D. Smith died 9 May 1893 and was buried in Greenwood Cemetery next to his first wife Manerva.

William and Thurza's daughter Laura Lorena married 18 June 1885 to Thomas Franklin Anderson<sup>14</sup>. Son John Andrew married 11 September 1890 to Maude A. Hays<sup>15</sup>.

On 15 January 1895, at age 57, William M. Kizer wrote a will and died three days later:

"Know all men by these presents that I William M. Kizer, of Franklin County in the State of Arkansas being ill in health but of sound and disposing mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me at anytime heretofore made.

1st I hereby constitute and appoint my wife Thursday M. Kizer to the sole executrix of this my last will directing my said executrix to pay all my just debts and funeral expenses.

2nd After the payment of my said debts and funeral expenses, I give and bequeath to my said wife all of my estate, real, personal and mixed to have and to hold and enjoy so long as she remains unmarried and my widow.

3rd At the marriage of my said wife or at her death it is my will and I hereby give and bequeath to my children John A. Kizer, Taylor E. Kizer, Clark M. Kizer, Madora J. Loyd, Laura L. Anderson and Martha M. Kizer, all of my estate then remaining, real, personal and mixed the same to be divided respectively share and share alike after the payment of the just debts and funeral expenses of my said wife.

In testimony whereof I hereto set my hand and publish and declare this to be my last will and testament in the presence of the witnesses named below, this 15th day of January 1895.

Kizer as and for this last will and testament in presence of us, who in his and in the presence of each other, and at this request have subscribed our names as witnesses thereto. 

For some reason, he marked his name with an "x", rather than with his full signature. The census entry for 1880 indicates he was literate and we have two Civil War letters presumably written by him personally. Perhaps he was too ill to be able to sign the will. (If more correspondence written by William emerges, we should be able to answer this question of his literacy.)

William M. Kizer was buried in the Bourland Cemetery in the Cravens community in Cravens Township. This cemetery is located about 75 yards south of Wire Road, which runs east-west through Cravens, and about 150 yards west of Cravens Creek. This is in the W ½ of the SE ¼ of Section 12 in Township 10 North, Range 28 West (T10N R28W). The northern edge of William's property is about ¾ miles SSE of this cemetery. (Each section in a township is one mile square.) William Kizer's gravestone is on the east side of the cemetery. The only other gravestone of his family found there (in 1973) was that of his infant granddaughter Flora Orilla Kizer (daughter of John Andrew Kizer), who died in 1892. Other family members were likely buried near him, including his wife Thurza (according to her 1919 obituary). (After I last visited this cemetery in the 1990s, someone erected a gravestone for Thurza, too.)

Later that same year, on 14 November 1895, William's oldest sister Nancy (Kizer) Baker Shaver died in Fort Gibson, Indian Territory (now in Wagoner County, Oklahoma).

William's son Taylor Earl Kizer (age 28, of Cravens) married on 28 September 1899 to Sarah Ann Thompson<sup>17</sup>. (Taylor and "Annie" were my great-grandparents. Their oldest son Demus, my grandfather, was born 20 July 1900.)

The 1900 census, in June of that year, shows only Clark and Martha remaining in Thurza's household. They were still living on the land in Cravens Township (south of Cravens community), but William's sister Susan was no longer there and brother John had (apparently) moved into town. John died 8 February 1901 and was buried in Hixon Cemetery (in Section 30 of T10N R27W, about ¼ mile south of the property he owned in Section 19) in Wallace Township.

Martha married Josiah Hood on 23 November 1902<sup>18</sup>. Clark never did marry.





By 1910, only Thurza and Clark remained in the household. By this time, they had moved from Cravens Township a bit further west into Mulberry Township, near the town of Lonelm. The census indicates that Clark was renting the property, so he must have disposed of the 200 acres in Cravens Township that his father had owned.

Thurza died on 3 March 1919 at the home of her son Taylor in Mulberry Township, near Lonelm. One of her children, most likely, wrote the following obituary:

"Gone But Not Forgotten

Ozark, Ark., March 23, 1919.

In memory of our dear mother, Mrs. Theresa Malinda Kizer, who departed this life March 3, 1919, at her son's Mr. Taylor Kizer. She had been a sufferer for about 15 years, but gradually grew worse until at last her spirit took its flight to the great beyond where there is no sorrow, pain nor death. Oh, how she did suffer, no one can tell. I was at her bedside a great deal and all was done that loving hands could do, but all in vain. She knew every thing until about one hour before she died; if she had lived until the 13<sup>th</sup> day of March she would have been 83 years old. She leaves one brother and one sister; six children and a host of grandchildren and friends. Four of her children were present during her sickness and death. Mrs. M. J. Loyd of Jenks, Okla. and

Mrs. Laura Anderson, of Floydada, Texas, came, but too late. She formerly made her home at her son's, John Kizer, but on the  $8^{th}$  of January she was taken to Taylor Kizer's to stay awhile. She visited around among her children.

Funeral service was conducted by Brother Jim McClellan, at the Bourland graveyard, where a large number was gathered to pay the last respect; after that she was laid to rest beside her husband, who departed this life 24 years ago. To know her was to love her. Loving words and advice she would give her children and grandchildren.

Weep not, children, mother can't come back to you, but you can meet her where there is on more good-byes.

She was born in Washington, Ark.; moved to Franklin county when about 13 years of age. Her mother died when she was a small girl and she stayed with her father until she was about 22 years old.

... – Written by one who loved her."

She was buried next to her husband William M. Kizer in the Bourland Cemetery in Cravens community.

#### **Epilogue**

William M. Kizer and his wife Thurza had nine children (of whom six survived infancy and five married and had families). There were 44 grandchildren and 145 great-grandchildren. Their six children who reached adulthood lived relatively long lives for that period, averaging 86.8 years. The last surviving child, Martha Malinda (Kizer) Hood, died in 1971. The descendants now living are primarily in Arkansas, Oklahoma, Texas, and California.

Jenny (Kizer) Loyd moved to Oklahoma around 1890 and died in Tulsa in 1948 at age 88. Laura (Kizer) Anderson moved to Texas by 1903 and died in Plainview in 1962 at age 96. John remained in Arkansas and died in Mulberry in 1943 at age 74. Taylor moved to California in the late 1930s and died in Fresno in 1968 at age 96. Clark remained in Arkansas and died in Little Rock in 1947 at age 74. Martha raised her family in Arkansas and moved to California after 1930. She died in Pomona in 1971 at age 93.




