“Marjorie J. Shambarger, 70, of 1032 N. Madison, Bruce Lake, Kewanna, Ind., died at 1:45 a.m. on Sept. 11, 2005, in the home of her daughter. She had briefly been ill.

Born in Attica on June 11, 1935, she was the daughter of Roy and Katherine Bowman Medly.

She was a 1953 graduate of Logansport High School and attended Purdue University.

She had resided in Fulton County since 1960, moving from Logansport.

Her marriage was to Charles K. Shambarger at the Fulton County Courthouse in April of 1979, and he died Jan. 28, 2004.

Mrs. Shambarger retired from Indiana Metal (now Torx) in 1980. She later worked at Elson’s Newsstand.

During the next five years, Marjorie enjoyed honeymooning with her husband Charles. In their travels they took up residence in some of America’s most interesting cities including Chicago, Manhattan and Atlanta before returning to Fulton County.

Marjorie was an artist and conveyed her talents by a variety of mediums. She was an accomplished poet, authoring meaningful poems about her family and intriguing yet simple things in life. She also expressed herself through paintings of landscapes, portraits and still life by using acrylics and oils.

Marjorie was passionate about her dollhouse collection. Each house offered a variety of amenities and furnishings specific for the dolls she treasured. She found great joy in gardening both flowers and vegetables. Paramount in life was her family. She always found time to read and tell stories to her grandchildren and chat with all of her kids.

“George A. SHAMBARGER, 59, well-known Macy resident, passed away this morning at his home following an acute heart attack. Shambarger had been ill for about five years, but was in serious condition only a few hours.

Born July 6, 1885 in Fulton county, he was the son of L. K. and Frances (ALLEN) SHAMBARGER. He resided most of his life in and around Macy. He practiced farming and retired a few years ago because of ill health.

On Aug. 17, 1912, he was united in marriage with Elizabeth GEAREN, and to this union were born one son, Glen [SHAMBARGER], now in service in the Aleutian Islands, and one daughter, Mrs. Charles SLISHER, Jr., of Macy. He was a member of the Perrysburg Baptist church.

Besides the wife, son and daughter, he is survived by five grandchildren; two sisters, Mrs. William WRIGHT and Mrs. Charles ALLEN of the Macy community, and four brothers, James [SHAMBARGER] of Peru, L. J. [SHAMBARGER] of Macy, Alfred [SHAMBARGER] of Fort Wayne and Dan [SHAMBARGER] of Macy.

The remains will be taken from the Ditmire mortuary at Fulton to the residence sometime Friday. Last rites will be held at 2 p.m. Sunday at the Macy Methodist church with the Rev. C. F. Also killed in the accident were another woman, believed to be from Champaign, Ill., and an infant boy. Another infant boy was injured and taken to Riley Childrens hospital, Indianapolis. The identity of the boy who was killed had not been determined at Sentinel press time. Mrs. Shambarger's parents told city police that she and her husband had left Rochester on a trip."

"A two-car, head-on crash on Ind. 3, just north of U.S. 40 in Henry county at 8:25 a.m. Monday claimed the lives of both Mrs. Shirley A. SHAMBARGER, 23, R.R. 3, Rochester, and her two-year-old son, James Lee [SHAMBARGER], state police reported today.

Also killed was Mrs. Vada Zelene EDMONDS, 22, R.R. 3, Livingston, Tenn., who was in the same car as Mrs. Shambarger. Mrs. Edmonds' four-year-old son, Ricky [EDMONDS], was listed in "critical" condition today at Riley Children's hospital in Indianapolis.

It was not until about 10 a.m. today that officers had verified without question the names and addresses of all three dead persons.

Police still are uncertain who was driving the car in which the three persons were killed, but state police at the Connersville post said today they believe Mrs. Shambarger was the driver.

The accident occurred on a curve at the foot of an overpass where Ind. 3 crosses over U.S. 40. State police said a northbound 1961 Ford, believed to have been driven by Mrs. Shambarger, crossed over the center line and smashed into a southbound 1968 Ford. The driver of the 1968 Ford, Henry V. DAHL, 58, Richmond, was injured and was reported in "good" condition today at a Richmond hospital. Mrs. Edmonds was thrown out of the car in which she was riding. Both vehicles were listed as total losses. State police said they have been unable to determine why the one car crossed over the center line.

Mrs. Shambarger was born Aug. 23, 1945 in South Bend to Raymond and Alice BENSMAN BARKER. She had lived the majority of her life in Fulton county.
