David H. Shambarger, age 76, resident of New Britain  
enrolled 22 Apr 1861, Waterloo, OH as Private in I 14 OH Infantry  
discharged 13 Aug 1861, Toledo, OH  
at enlistment: 5'7-1/2", blue eyes, brown hair, carpenter  
born 12 Jan 1831 @ Mechanicsburg, Cumberland Co., PA  
residences since enlistment: Waterville and Maumee, OH until 20 Sep 1904, since then in New  
Britain, CT  
witness: Helen M. Winchester (of New Britain, CT)

*Gospel Messenger, 23 Feb 1892, Obituary of John Henry Shamberger [#12] {7202}*

"In Barber Co., Kans., Bro. John Shamberger, aged 77 years, one month and seven days. Deceased was born in Baltimore Co., Md., Nov. 4, 1814. He united with the Brethren Church in 1857. He was united in marriage with Elizabeth Markey and they were blessed in 7 children, 5 sons and 2 daughters, one of the latter died in infancy. Two of the sons are in the ministry; the other two are deacons. In the spring of 1868 Bro. Shamberger and family moved to Nodaway Co., Mo. There his companion was called away by death in July, 1883. In the spring of 1887, he emigrated to Barber Co., Kans., where he lived with his son. J.H. Shamberger until Dec 11, 1891, when he was called to his reward. The funeral was preached by the undersigned, Dec 13, at the house of Bro. J.H. Shamberger to a sympathizing congregation from Rev. 14:13."
